Sophomore Review

At the end of the fifth semester of applied lessons, students are evaluated during the jury exam for advancement to upper division applied study (400 level). If a student does not pass this Sophomore Performance Review, the student may enroll again in 200 level applied study the following semester and may take the Sophomore Performance Review again. Written comments describing issues that need to be addressed and a remediation plan will be provided to the student. A student who fails the Sophomore Performance Review a second time will be denied future registration in applied instruction. However, students may re-audition for entrance into applied study by submitting a request for audition during one of the scheduled College of Musical Arts audition days. Students should consult their applied instructor for any specific performance requirements for the Sophomore Performance Review.

Senior Recital

At least one full recital is required of all performance studies majors. This is usually given in the fifth year. Permission to perform the recital is granted by the appropriate performance studies faculty, and is based upon the student's performance at a recital jury. A student must be registered for applied study during the semester in which the recital is presented, and must register for MUSP 495 (Senior Recital).

Recital Attendance

All 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th years are required to attend 15 music recitals or concerts on campus each semester (public performances acceptable). Students majoring in music must register for and successfully complete eight semesters of MUS 99 (Recital Attendance). Students are also required to attend biweekly seminars according to major applied medium.

INSTRUCTIONS:

You must complete an official junior audit with your college advisor during your **4**th **year** [100-115 hours]. To do so, you must schedule an appointment with your college advisor. You should bring a completed copy of this check sheet and a current copy of your Degree Audit Reporting System (DARS) report. Your college advisor will provide you with a detailed form that specifies your remaining requirements for graduation.

FOR GRADUATION YOU WILL NEED

- 1. Minimum GPA of 2.0 in all PSYC and MUCT courses
- 2. 28 hours of PSYC (14) and MUCT(14) courses taken at Crescendo College
- 3. Minimum GPA 2.5
- 4. 152 credit hours minimum, and,
- 5. 40 credit hours at the 400/500 level
- 6. Completion of all degree requirements, including the Compulsory Crescendo Credits
- 7. At least 40 credit hours of Crescendo course work
- 8. An official audit completed during the 4th year, on file in the College Office

Any substitution or waiver of courses required for your major program <u>must</u> originate in the department/school offering the major program and <u>must</u> be approved by the College Office.

To ensure a timely graduation, see your <u>College Advisor</u> during the semester prior to your intended graduation. Remember to complete an <u>Application for Graduation</u> by the end of the second week of classes during the fall and spring semes-ters, or by the end of the first week of the summer semester. For the specific dates, check with the College office or the Office of Registration and Records. You may log onto **MyCrescendo** to complete the on-line application. After the deadlines, you will need to complete an application in person in the College office.
